

We appreciate the Whiteside Area Career Center for hosting the Sauk Valley Community Leadership Program on March 4. We began the morning with Natalie Pratt, Illinois Association FFA President, from Amboy, Illinois. Natalie dazzled us with an overview of FFA from all angles--she could answer any question with great poise and confidence. We were thrilled she could find the time to spend us in her whirlwind year as President.



Next, we participated in an eye-opening, powerful Q & A with a panel of local education leaders: Lindsay Stumpfenhorst, Whiteside Area Career Center principal; Ron McCord, Superintendent, Rock Falls High School; and Sarah McFarlane, Program Director of SVCC Adult Ed and Project VITAL, Sauk Valley Community College.



After the panel, Josh Johnson, Whiteside Area Career Center Director, gave the cohort a comprehensive tour of the incredible career and technical programs available to area students. WACC Culinary Arts students provided a delicious luncheon.



March 18th's session began at John Thomas, Inc. with a discussion and tour of JTI with Tom Dvorak, General Manager of JTI. John Thomas, Inc. designs and manufactures portable traffic signals, automated flagger assistance devices (AFADs) and other solutions that make roadways safer. We then traveled to UPM Raflatac for a panel discussion on leadership in the manufacturing community. The panel included an insightful conversation about leadership in the manufacturing world: Steve Meiners, Vice President of Crest Foods, Ashton, IL.; Luke Coers, General Manufacturing Manager at Sewer Equipment, Dixon, IL; and Eric Fliessinger, General Manager of UPM Raflatac. Eric, the general manager of the Dixon Plant, along with his team took us on a guided tour. Did you know that UPM's automation, safety protocols, and robotics create enough label materials in a year that could wrap the earth 6 times?
