In addition to fabulous live theatre, Timber Lake Playhouse offers an outdoor beer garden complete with a stage for special concerts and events throughout the season. Nestled in the country-side of northwest Illinois, one feels as if the world was their own as you stroll down to the lake, explore the campus or enjoy a nice cold beverage on a hot day at our full-service bar. Under the guidance of Tommy Ranieri, Timber Lake's Artistic Director, productions have already begun, starting with our theatre for young audiences offering, Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus as part of our Magic Owl Children's Theatre. This show launched the 2025 season and introduced more than 1,700 school-aged children to the wonder of live theatre!

Like many nonprofit arts organizations, Timber Lake Playhouse has faced some challenges this year. A major flood destroyed one of the actor housing buildings in January 2025. Thousands of dollars in damages required new flooring, bedding and appliances; costs also included cleaning, drywalling and painting. Our community came to the rescue! We deeply appreciate Knie Appliances and Furniture and McKenna's Floor Coverings for their generous donation of materials, individuals who raised funds for blankets, sheets and pillows through the March Madness Tournament and, of course, our dedicated staff and volunteers who put the finishing touches on the house – all in time to welcome our 2025 resident company.
